Library News

Japanese Storyteller

Last week in the library, Midori Thiel taught classes about traditional Japanese folktales, drama, and music. Midori shared many masks used in the Omote tradition of storytelling. She performed dances from some of the Kyogen dramas. She also played the koto and shamisen. Midori demonstrated how the koto is strung, tsume (fingertip picks) and how to press on strings to create different sounds. Thank you to the Arts Commission for sponsoring this culturally rich event.

What is RIF?

Your child selected a free RIF book this week. Please be sure to ask them about it—and better yet, sit down and read the book together with your child. Three times per year, students select a free book. Reading Is Fundamental (RIF) is a national organization whose sole purpose is to encourage literacy in the homes of children. In order to do this, children need books of their own to read and reread in their homes. Scholastic is the main RIF distributor so sometimes the selection of titles can be limited. Thank you to the JSIS PTSA which also funds a portion of the book distribution cost. Due to student demographic changes, JSIS most likely will no longer qualify as a RIF school in the years to come.

Electronic Overdue Notices

The JSIS library is going green! Besides checking out and reusing books every day, now book overdue notices are sent electronically. Every few weeks, an email will be sent letting parents know what books your child has checked out. The loan period for a book is one week. Children should return books to the library every week. Most students return books on their designated class library day. In addition, the library is also open at 9:00 am most mornings so students can drop off books and check out new ones.

If a book is overdue, please help your child return it as soon as possible. If your child is still reading a book, then it can be renewed. Besides popular titles (such as Diary of a Wimpy Kid and most graphic novels), students can renew their books for up to one month if needed. If a book is lost, please pay for it or contact me about replacement options. Library books stay in the classroom for the kindergarteners and students in Ms. Wei's BOC class.
